GOD IS READY FOR A REVIVAL, ARE YOU?

Psalm 139: 23-24

“Search me, O God, and know my heart; test my thought. Point out anything you find in me that makes you sad, and lead me along the path of everlasting life.”

This work sheet/Devotional contains personal information and questions that are to be used by you alone as a personal preparation for a personal Revival. These questions are to help “jumpstart” your cleansing time with God. Confession of sin is necessary for fellowship with God and Revival among God’s people.

These are broken down into 13 very short segments. Do only one a day over the next two weeks leading up to your Church’s Revival. The process is real simple. Read the verse and prayerfully consider the questions.

Every “YES” answer means sin in your life.

After each section is completed a moment of silence should be allowed for private prayer with God. As your day unfolds, reflect on that days, or a past days topic and questions and look for ways to apply God’s truth to your life. Do not let your recognition of sin in your life go without dealing with it!

If you have been honest and true in the matter of admitting your sins, then you are ready for God's cleansing. Sins that are admitted, are sins that are confessed. Remember these things:

- If the sin is against God, confess it to God, and make things right with God.
- If the sin is against another person, confess it to God and make things right with the other person.
- If the sin is against a group, confess it to God, and then make it right with the group.
- If there is full confession, then there will be full cleansing. Then the joy of the Lord will follow. Then there can be testimony and prayer in the power of the Holy Spirit. Revival will follow.

1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

If you feel that God wants you to share the burden of your sin publicly with your brothers and sisters, please do so! Refusing to do so will quench the Holy Spirit.

Continue through the work sheet one day at a time until all questions have been reviewed and forgiveness is found.

PROVERBS 28:13

**“He who covers his sins will not prosper,
But whoever confesses and forsakes
them will have mercy.”**

Day I.

**John 13:35 - “By this all will know that you
are My disciples, if you have love for one
another.”**

Is there anyone against whom you hold a grudge,
harbor bitterness, resentment or jealousy?

Anyone you haven't forgiven? Anyone you
hate? Anyone you do not love?

Are you secretly pleased over the misfortunes of
another, or annoyed over the accomplishments
or advancements of another? Anyone you
dislike to hear praised or well spoken of?

Do you ever, by word or deed, seek to hurt
someone? Is there anyone you deliberately
slight?

Do you gossip? Do you speak unkindly
concerning people when they are not present?

Day II.

Ephesians 4:31 - “Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice.”

Do you complain?

Do you find fault?

Are you stubborn?

Do you have a critical attitude towards any person or thing?

Do you ever carry hidden anger?

Are you irritable, cranky, harsh or unkind?

Do you become impatient with others?

Day III.

Hebrews 13:17 - “Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for yours souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you.”

Do you hesitate to submit to leaders in the church or elsewhere? Have you failed to pray regularly for your pastor or other spiritual leaders?

Do you rebel at requests given to you to help in the work of the Gospel?

Do you, in any way, have a stubborn or unteachable spirit? Do you find it hard to be corrected?

Have you dishonored God and hindered His work by criticizing His servants?

Day IV.

I Corinthians 4:2 - "Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful."

Are you undependable so that you cannot be trusted with responsibilities in the Lord's work?

How are your work habits on your job? Are you lazy? Do you waste time? Do you waste time for others?

Have you been careless in the payment of your debts? Have you sought to evade payment of debts?

Do you spend beyond what is pleasing to God on anything?

Do you neglect to pray about things you buy?

Day V.

Matthew 6:33 - “But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you.”

Is there anything in which you have failed to put God first? Have you disobeyed some direct leading from Him?

Have your decisions been made after your own wisdom and desires, rather than seeking and following God’s will?

Do any of the following, in any way, interfere with your surrender and service to God: ambition, pleasures, loved ones, friendships, desire for recognition, money, your own plans?

Are you more concerned about what people will think, than what will be pleasing to God?

Have you neglected or slighted your daily or private prayer? Have you neglected God’s Word? Do you find the Bible and prayer interesting? Have you neglected thanksgiving at meals? Do you neglect family devotions?

Day VI.

Mark 16:15 - "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

Have you failed to seek the lost for Christ?

Has your life been a Christian example to the Lost?

Have you failed to witness consistently with your mouth for the Lord Jesus Christ?

Is there someone in particular that God is laying on your heart that either needs to be saved or needs Revival in their lives? Pray for God to give you the courage to speak to them!

Day VII.

Malachi 3:8 - “Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed me! But you say, ‘In what way have we robbed you?’ In tithes and offerings.”

Have you robbed God by withholding His due of time, talents and money?

Have you given less than a tenth of your income for God’s work?

Have you failed to support mission work either in prayer or in offerings?

Day VIII.

I Corinthians 6:19-20 - “Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God’s.”

Are you, in any way, careless with your body? Do you have any personal habits that are not pure? Do you fail to care for your body as the temple of the Holy Spirit?

Do you allow impure thoughts about the opposite sex to stay in your mind? Are you guilty of the lustful look?

Are you guilty of intemperance in eating or drinking?

Do you listen to unedifying radio or TV programs? Do you read unworthy, impure magazines or books?

Do you partake in worldly amusements? Do you find it necessary to seek satisfaction from any questionable source?

Day IX.

James 4:6 - “But He gives more grace. Therefore He says: ‘God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble.’”

Do you take the slightest credit for anything good about your life rather than give all the glory to God?

Do you talk of what you have done rather than of what Christ has done? Are your statements mostly about “I” or about God?

Are your feelings easily hurt?

Have you made a pretense of being something you are not?

Day X.

Ephesians 3:20 - “Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us.”

Do you allow feelings of inferiority to keep you from attempting things you should in serving God?

Are you self-conscious rather than Christ-conscious?

Do you doubt God by worrying if He can meet your needs?

Day XI.

Ephesians 5:20 - "Giving thanks always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Have you neglected to thank Him for all things, the seemingly bad, as well as the good?

Have you virtually called God a liar in doubting His Word?

Do you carry any bitterness toward God?

Have you complained against Him in any way?

Have you been dissatisfied with His provision for you?

Day XII.

Colossians 3:9 - “Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds.”

Do you mislead others about things to make yourself look good?

Do you ever lie? Exaggerate? Cheat? Steal?

Day XIII.

Hebrews 10:25 - “Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.”

Are you irregular in attendance at services?

Do you pay attention while God’s Word is being read or preached or do focus on other things?

When you are with other Christians, do you encourage them or are you a negative influence?

YOUR PERSONAL REVIVAL COVENANT WITH GOD:

If you have found things that you need to repent of then you must repent! If not, you will be hindering your walk with The Lord and preventing Revival in your own life!

Can you honestly say:

“Before God, I acknowledge that I have to the best of my ability read through these questions. I have confessed to God any sins that He brought to my mind. I accept His cleansing and I am ready for a personal Revival in my life!”

If not, do that right now and receive God's cleansing. If you have...CONGRATULATIONS!

**YOU ARE ON THE ROAD TO YOUR OWN
PERSONAL REVIVAL!**

Once you have prayed concerning your own walk with God, now you are ready to pray for others!!

GOD IS READY FOR REVIVAL, ARE YOU?
VERSES ONLY

(These are the same verses as above. However, I have left off the questions so you can allow the HOLY SPIRIT to guide you in their personal application.)

Remember, No Revival has ever taken place without the confession and cleansing of sins in God's people. Take your time and read through each of these verses. Allow God to apply the verse to **YOUR** life. In this phase of preparation, do not pray for anyone else. Focus on your self! I am not going to elaborate on the verses. I believe God will help you apply them to your life.

PROVERB 28:13

**“He who covers his sins will not prosper,
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will have mercy.”**

Read one verse at a time and let God speak to you and show you where you need forgiveness.

- If the sin is against God, confess it to God, and make things right with God.
- If the sin is against another person, confess it to God and make things right with the other person.
- If the sin is against a group, confess it to God, and then make it right with the group.

If there is full confession, then there will be full cleansing. Then the joy of the Lord will follow. Then there can be testimony and prayer in the power of the Holy Spirit. Just Read the verse and pray, “Lord, please bring to mind if and how I have failed you in this area.”

As you are convicted of the sin in your life, **confess** it at once to God. Be willing to **Repent** (turn from) the sin. Then you can claim cleansing and forgiveness!

Begin with the verse below....

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Hebrews 13:17 - “Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for yours souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you.”

Matthew 6:33 - “But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you.”

Mark 16:15 - “Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.”

Malachi 3:8 - "Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed me! But you say, 'In what way have we robbed you?' In tithes and offerings."
